Farm Fresh Flavor

MIXED GREEN SALAD WITH PICKLED STRAWBERRIES, RADISHES & HERBED GOAT CHEESE

Pickled Strawberries & Radishes (Prepare a day before)

- 1 cup of strawberries, cleaned & halved
- 1 cup radishes, cleaned and thinly sliced
- 1 teaspoon whole peppercorns
- 2 cups red wine vinegar
- 3/4 cups sugar
- 2 Tablespoons honey
- 1 teaspoon canning/pickling or sea salt

Clean and cut radishes and strawberries and place into jars with peppercorns. Bring brine ingredients to a boil and pour over strawberries & radishes in jars. Put on lids and let sit until slightly cooled, then place in fridge to pickle overnight. Pickles may be stored in refrigerator for approx 2 weeks.

Vinaigrette

- 1 oz brine from pickled strawberries
- 3 oz grapeseed or other light salad oil
- 1 Tablespoon spicy mustard

Stir together mustard & pickling brine, whisk continually while slowly pouring in oil to create a smooth vinaigrette.

Assemble Salad

Cut or form goat cheese into approx. 1" diameter log, roll in finely chopped herb mixture (parsley, tarragon, chervil & thyme) and refrigerate until ready to serve. Toss mixed greens with vinaigrette, adding just enough to coat leaves. Remove herbed goat cheese from fridge and cut into 1/4" rounds. Plate dressed mixed greens with pickled strawberries & radishes, goat cheese & garnish with sunflower seeds, toasted pine nuts or slivered almonds. Salt & pepper to taste. Serve and enjoy!


